Chief Justice Robert G.
Richards was appointed to the
Court of Appeal in 2004 and
named Chief Justice in 2013. He
received a B.Comm (1975) and
LL.B. (1979) from the University
of Saskatchewan and an LL.M.
(1982) from Harvard Law School.
The Chief Justice was counsel in
over 40 Supreme Court of Canada

appeals. The Chief Justice has held numerous leadership positions in the legal community including Chair of the Supreme Court of Canada – Canadian Bar Association Liaison Committee and Co-Chair of the National Canadian Bar Association Constitutional and Human Rights Law Section. He is a frequent, long-time lecturer at the College of Law, University of Saskatchewan and at the Bar Admission Course.
