SOCIAL JUSTICE FOR NEW IMMIGRANTS AND REFUGEES IN CANADA

Recently, Canada has seen a significant increase in the number of immigrants, refugees and asylum seekers. But, is Canada well-prepared to truly welcome them? The evidence suggests this marginalized and vulnerable population group suffers social injustices and inequalities in Canada; they have one of the poorest health outcomes in the country. To address this wicked and complex social and policy problem, policy makers need to address the social determinants of health (the conditions in which people live, work, grow, and age) of this population group such as income, employment, education, discrimination, culture, and language. We need to find ways to build multi-sectoral collaborations among different sectors of society around the common purpose of creating more just, culturally-safe, and sustainable communities.
