## What is a case competition?

Case competitions are valuable experiential learning opportunities for students to test their knowledge and ability to think quickly and critically in a simulated role play scenario.

The top students from the JSGS Case Competition go on to represent the school in the 2016 IPAC/CAPPA National Public Administration Case Competition hosted by the uOttawa in Ottawa in February.

## How does it work?

Students teams are judged on their ability to provide options and recommendations on complex policy issues to a panel of experienced and professional judges. Students will be required to analyze two different cases throughout the day, and to develope both a written policy brief and a verbal presentation. Participation in the JSGS Case Competition is worth three JSGS 990 credits.
