



My Rights, Your Rights, or Our Rights

People generally resolve conflict in one of three ways- based on power, rights, or interests. We will discuss negotiating between the three approaches and focus in particular on the advantages of rights-based and interest-based problem solving.

Kevin Fenwick, Q.C., is a problem solver, champion of innovation, and Deputy Minister and Deputy Attorney General for the province of Saskatchewan. His legal career started after graduating from the College of Law at the University of Saskatchewan in 1980. He practiced law in Melville for 15 years before leaving to pursue his interest in mediation and dispute resolution. Armed with a belief in collaborative problem solving, Kevin worked as a mediator and facilitator for 20 years, much of it with the provincial Dispute Resolution Office. He then served as the Ombudsman for Saskatchewan, overseeing the investigation of public complaints against the provincial government. Now, Kevin is spearheading change. He's putting forth innovative initiatives aimed at making justice services more efficient, accessible and affordable for citizens. Throughout it all, Kevin remains deeply-rooted in rural Saskatchewan. His job — and the Riders — is in Regina, but he hangs his hat at the family farm near Balcarres every night.
